before: Before I left home, I had called a taxi.

After: After I had called a taxi, I left home.

because: I was hungry because I had not eaten. by the time: By the time I arrived to the theatre, the play had started.

when: We remembered the day when Ali had first arrived

Once: Once they had answered the questions, I gave them a breathing space.


No sooner:

No sooner had the guests left than the waiters started washing the dishes.

Hardly:

Hardly had the guests left when the waiters started washing the dishes.
