She was able to overcome her handicap and achieve first place in Kuwait at the "Arab Reading Challenge" contest, beating 16,000 Arab students by reading 50 books. She also participated in the "Arab Reading Challenge Champion" contest in the United Arab Emirates among 18 Arab students who have reached the final stage of the competition.

One of the difficulties facing Al-Azmi is the lack of many books in Braille, a method of writing invented to help the blind to read. Al-Azmi said in a



statement published by the Organizing Committee of the competition that she was a lover of reading, and that her visual handicap did not stand a barrier between her and the world around her. development of the lower spine.

Doctors told his family he probably would not survive. Ghanim, whose name means 'winner' in Arabic, has incredibly inspired people around the world by surviving and becoming an athlete. He shares his story of hope, determination and giving, and his dream of becoming a Paralympian.
