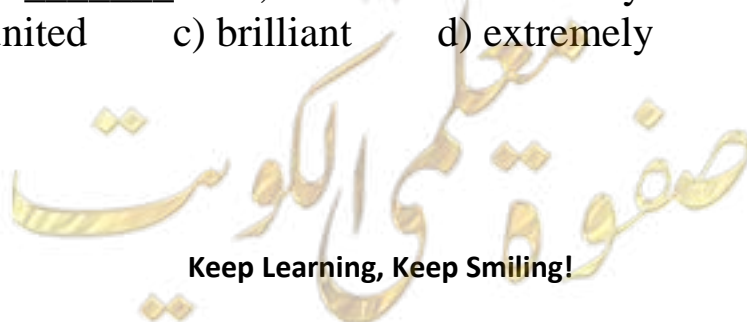

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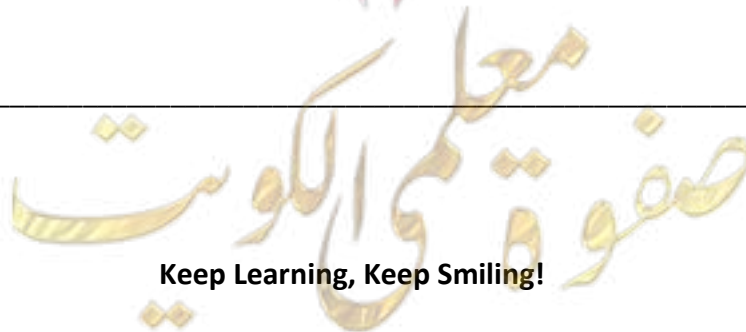

Each class was tasked with organising a small display or activity to raise awareness about recycling and sustainability. Mr Adams, the science teacher, encouraged his students to think creatively and work together.
